Editorial

If I were you, I would fire the editor of *The Cockerel*. In his editorial of the last issue of this magazine (number 229) he had the audacity to predict that, by this time, along with Christmas carols, we would also be singing the praises of Spurs.

Not that I have any personal interest in the matter but, to be fair to the editor, I have to say that that editorial was written on the 31st of October, 2023 when Spurs were still very much on a high. They were on an unbeaten, ten-match run and were top of the Premier League table on twenty-six points with eight wins and just two draws. Moreover, at that time, the editor was clever enough to qualify his prediction by including the condition: *if things continue going the way they were going then*.

Alas, they didn't! Following that formidable start to the season, Spurs lost the next three matches on the trot. Then, as if inconsistency were a virtue, they stopped the bleeding by drawing 3-3 away against none other than the reigning champions, Manchester City, and, following that, once again, succumbed 1-2 at home to West Ham United. But Spurs never fail to surprise me. From there, they thrashed in-form Newcastle United 4-1, Beat Nottingham Forest 0-2 on their own piece of turf and even saw past Everton 2-1 at home before stumbling again 4-2 against Brighton & Hove Albion at the Amex Stadium. A late rally, in the last ten minutes of that game, produced two Spurs goals; one from Davies and another from Veliz. But that wasn't enough although, if Spurs had more time, no one can tell what might have happened then. Another consolation was that Spurs ended the year 2023 on a winning note thanks to a 3-1 home victory over Bournemouth on New Year's Eve.

It is true that the absence of key players due to injury or suspension is being sorely felt, especially, that of James Maddison and of Cristian Romero. But this is the problem with many other sides in the Premier League and, so, it is no excuse. We still have other star players who can take their place and still do a good job.

Because of their late sins, Spurs are now no longer the leaders of the league table. At the time of writing, they are not even among the top four, Champions' League spots. A little over half way through the season, Spurs are in fifth place on thirty-nine points after having played twenty games of which they won twelve, drew three and lost five. But they are still very much in contention as only six points separate them from the team at the top of the table. And six points are not so many in this frantic Premier League campaign. Everybody forfeits points along the way. So, come on you Spurs! You can still do it, if you really put your mind to it, that is. As we come into the straight, what is needed is one, real good, collective effort and it can be achieved. We have a good horse and a good jockey as well and I can see no reason why Spurs should not be among the contenders come May 2024, when all the horses, finally, reach the finishing line.

PREMIER LEAGUE Match Reports



06 - 11 - 23 Tottenham Hotspur 1 Chelsea 4



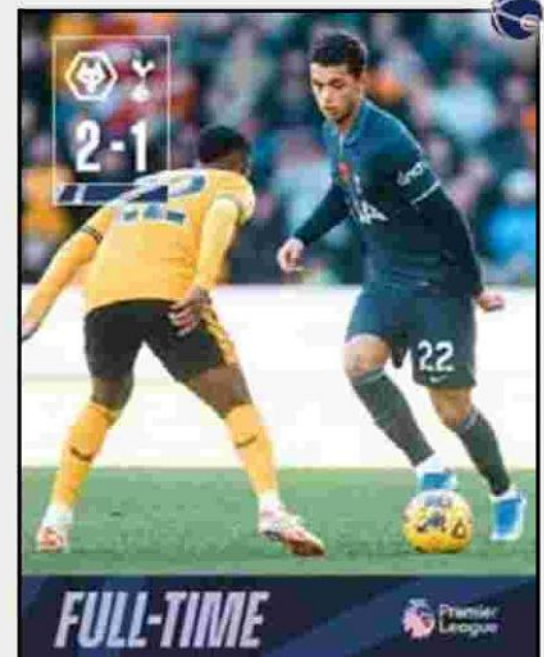
We made a breathtaking start and led when Dejan Kulusevski's shot deflected home on seven minutes. Chelsea couldn't live with our high press and the sheer intensity of our play and we were millimetres from 2-0 when Son's goal was ruled out for offside by VAR. Chelsea settled, though, and had goals from Sterling and Caicedo ruled out by VAR. In the second one, although Cristian Romero clearly won the ball, he was not only adjudged to have fouled Fernandez in the box but was also shown a straight red for tackling with excessive force. We went down to ten men and Palmer levelled it up from the spot, although Guglielmo Vicario managed to tip onto the post. Cruelly, we then lost van de Ven and Maddison to injury and, ten minutes into the second half, we were down to nine men when Destiny Udogie received a second yellow card. We defended superbly for the next twenty minutes as Chelsea couldn't get their final pass right. When they did, Vicario was outstanding and, somehow, Pierre-Emile Hojbjerg scrambled Jackson's header over the bar. Eventually, Chelsea broke through when Sterling broke the offside trap and slid in Jackson on seventy-five minutes. Spurred on by the home crowd, we not only kept going but we also created three chances and almost pulled a result out of the fire. But it wasn't to be as Jackson took advantage of the space at the back to complete his hat-trick.



11 - 11 - 23 Wolverhampton Wanderers 2 Tottenham Hotspur 1



Two late, late strikes at Molineux condemned us to a second Premier League defeat in a week as we fell 2-1 at Wolverhampton. Having enjoyed the most perfect of starts against Wanderers, as Brennan Johnson bagged his first goal for the Club on three minutes to give us an early advantage, we were, for the most part, second best to the West Midlands side across the ninety minutes. Relentlessly harrying us throughout the game, their dominance showed in the statistics as they hit seventeen shots to our six and, despite us showing incredible resilience, it was eventually broken. Sarabia levelled spectacularly for the hosts on ninety minutes with a stinging volley before Lemina steered home as we chased a winner in the seventh minute of injury time to see all three points stay in Wolverhampton.





26 - 11 - 23 Tottenham Hotspur 1 Aston Villa 2



We suffered our third straight defeat despite a strong performance as Aston Villa came from behind to take the points at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium. Starting his first PL game in over two years, Giovanni Lo Celso fired us ahead on twenty-two minutes after we missed a number of opportunities but Villa levelled on the stroke of half-time through Torres and took the win after Watkins struck just after the hour mark. We opened the score on twenty-two minutes when Pedro Porro's corner was cleared to the edge of the area and Lo Celso drilled a left-footed shot which flicked off Carlos on its way past Martinez. Despite a dominant first half, we went in level at the break as Villa scored seven minutes into stoppage time; Douglas Luiz delivering a wonderful cross and Torres made sure to head past Vicario. And the goalkeeper couldn't do anything to prevent Villa taking the lead in the 61st minute. Watkins played the ball in to Tielemans and took the return pass on the edge of the box before sliding it into the bottom corner. We thought we were level in the 85th minute when Son tapped home after Pedro Porro struck the far post but, again, up went the assistant's flag for offside. And with Emerson Royal's glancing header going wide, our chance of salvaging a point was lost. The result sees us drop to fifth in the table as Villa climbed above us with this victory.



03 - 12 - 23 Manchester City 3 Tottenham Hotspur 3



Dejan Kulusevski scored a dramatic late equaliser to earn us a well-deserved point in a six-goal thriller against Manchester City. Despite missing a whole host of first-team players and having lost our previous three games, we matched the reigning champions stride-for-stride and left the Etihad Stadium with a draw as our Swedish forward headed home in the 90th minute to make it 3-3. Earlier, Heung-Min Son fired us ahead only to put through his own net, all inside the opening ten minutes while the home side took the lead for the first time through Foden and were in front at the break. But Giovanni Lo Celso scored for the second straight game to make it 2-2, only for Grealish to come off the bench and put City back ahead again. We weren't to be denied though; Kulusevski's dramatic intervention giving us the point our brave performance deserved. The closing stages were anxious as City pushed everything forward, claiming for all sorts of decisions with VAR even checking for a late penalty after Akanji went down with Oliver Skipp in attendance while City were also aggrieved at a late refereeing decision but, ultimately, we held out for a wonderful point.



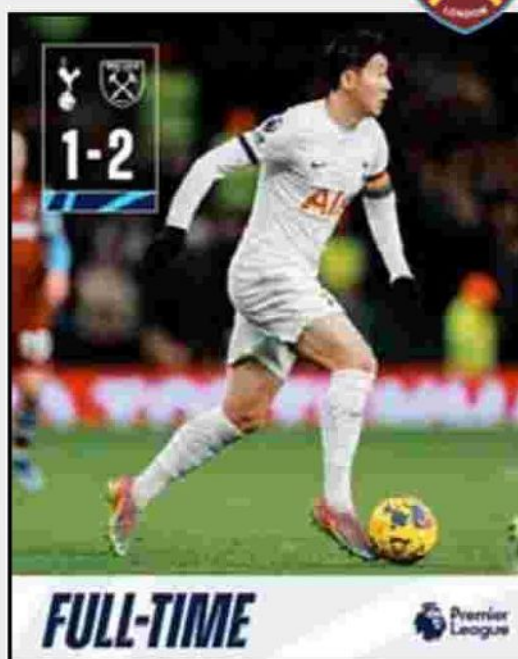


07 - 12 - 23

Tottenham Hotspur 1 West Ham United 2



Romero marked his return to action with a goal but it was West Ham who left north London with the points as they came from behind to take the spoils at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium. Our Argentinian defender headed home early on as he returned after a three-game suspension and we were totally dominant in the first half but it was a different story after the break with the Hammers netting through Bowen and Ward-Prowse to inflict our fourth defeat in five games. We made a great start and, with ten minutes on the clock, we grabbed the lead from a corner. Pedro Porro delivered the cross and Romero climbed highest to send a header looping over Fabianski into the top corner. But, after all our early domination, the visitors showed more intent and leveled it up on fifty-two minutes. That changed the direction of the game as it became a more even affair with both sides feeling the points were there for the taking. And it was West Ham who took the lead. Udogie's pass back to Vicario fell short, the keeper rushed out to push the ball away from the chasing Bowen but only as far as Ward-Prowse who hit the post with his initial effort but the ball rolled back to him and he tucked home into an empty net.



10 - 12 - 23 Tottenham Hotspur 4 Newcastle United 1



An outstanding performance in all areas of the pitch led to a resounding 4-1 victory over Newcastle at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium as we returned to winning ways in emphatic style. For the tenth consecutive game, we scored the first goal but, unlike our previous five matches, this time, we didn't let it slip. Destiny Udogie broke the deadlock and we rammed home the advantage to ensure we claimed maximum points; Richarlison's brace giving us a cushion before Heung-Min Son scored late on with our first penalty of the season. Unfortunately, we let the clean sheet slip away in injury time, Joelinton netting for the visitors. We took the lead on twenty-six minutes when Udogie played the ball out to Son, who worked a yard of space down the left to shift away from Kieran Trippier and whipped in a dangerous cross which Udogie tapped home from close range. We made it 2-0 soon after as Son, this time, skipped past his former team-mate, Trippier, in the box near the by-line and cut back for Richarlison to convert from six yards out. We put the game to bed with a wonderful third on the hour mark. Porro was the creator with a sumptuous pass in to Richarlison who controlled and slid the ball under Dubravka. Then, in the 84th minute, Dubravka upended Son in the box who picked himself up to beat the Magpies' keeper from twelve yards. It could even have been much worse for the visitors but, instead, they did grab a stoppage-time consolation goal when we lost the ball just outside our area and Wilson squared for Joelinton to slide home.





15 - 12 - 23 Nottingham Forest 0 Tottenham Hotspur 2



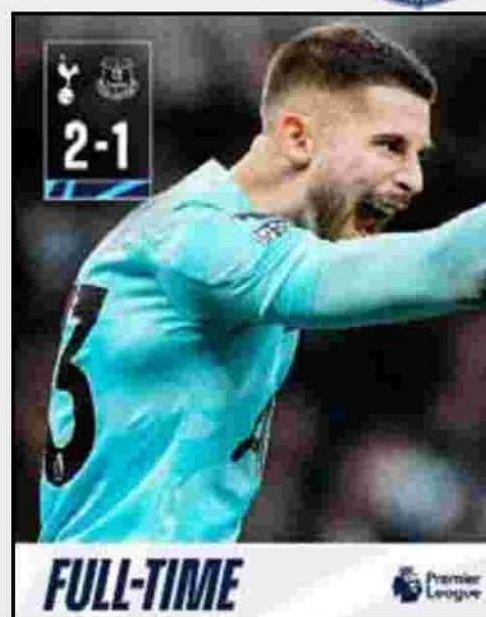
A battling performance yielded maximum points at the City Ground as our ten men held out for an important and hard-fought 2-0 victory over Nottingham Forest. Richarlison's first-half header was added to by a fine strike from the excellent Kulusevski after the break but we had to survive the final twenty minutes plus stoppage time with only ten players after midfielder Bissouma received his second red card of the season. Chances came and went at both ends; Pedro Porro arriving late to send a header wide from Son's cross while Gibbs-White lashed well wide at the other end before we took the lead in first-half stoppage time. The ball was worked out to Kulusevski down the right, he cut inside and delivered a wonderful cross for Richarlison who got between Boly and Turner to head home. That was the eleventh consecutive PL game in which we'd opened the score and the twenty-ninth straight league match in which we'd scored. A poor ball out from the keeper enabled us to double the lead. His pass went straight to our Swedish international forward who broke into the area and smashed a shot into the back of the net. Moments later, we were dealt a blow when Bissouma was sent off for a challenge on Yates after the referee was advised to check the tackle on the pitch-side monitor, upgrading the yellow card he had originally given him to a red. With the man advantage, Forest were naturally seeing more of the ball without really creating too much and, instead, Kulusevski almost added a third in the eighty-first minute but Turner got down quickly to keep out his left-foot shot.



23 - 12 - 23 Tottenham Hotspur 2 Everton 1



We celebrated our last game before Christmas with the present of three hard-earned points thanks to a 2-1 victory over Everton at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium. Two goals in the opening eighteen minutes saw us take control of the game as Richarlison scored against his former club and Heung-Min Son doubled our lead. Everton had a goal ruled out through VAR before pulling one back in the 82nd minute through Gomes and pushed us all the way in the closing stages but our defence held firm to take the win. A wonderful move in the ninth minute saw us take the lead for the twelfth consecutive game as Porro and Sarr combined to release Johnson and his low cross was clinically converted by Richarlison. It was also the thirtieth straight PL game in which we'd scored. Opportunities kept coming at both ends before we added our second on eighteen minutes from a well-worked corner routine. Porro played it to Kulusevski, he threaded a pass which released Johnson whose angled drive was saved by Pickford but



the loose ball fell to Son who hit a shot which bobbled in from fifteen yards. The visitors did pull one back in the 82nd minute; Gomes drilling home with an angled drive after we cleared a corner. They almost drew level moments later but for a wonderful save from Vicario to deny substitute Danjuma's rocket and Davies clearing Tarkowski's header off the line from the resulting corner. It was certainly a nervy end to the contest as Everton pushed us for the equalizer but it remained 2-1.



28 - 12 - 23 Brighton & Hove Albion 4 Tottenham Hotspur 2



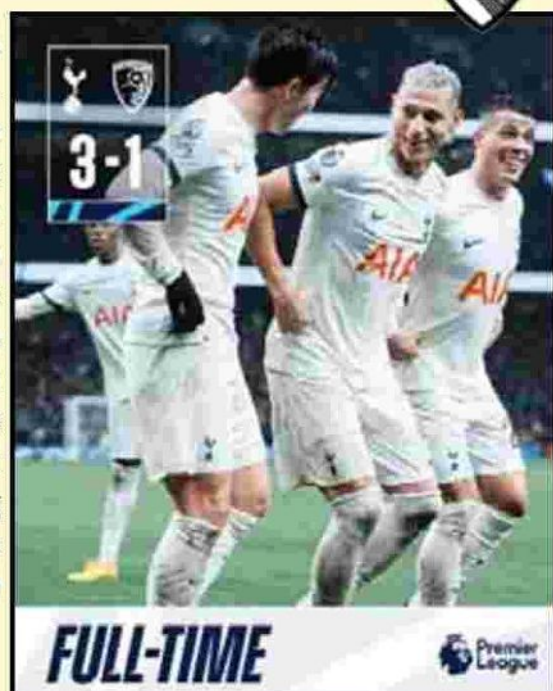
Young striker Alejo Veliz scored his first Premier League goal but it was a disappointing trip to the south coast as Brighton took the points with a 4-2 victory. On just eleven minutes, Brighton went ahead when Jack Hinshelwood fired home. Then, with twenty-three minutes on the clock, Joao Pedro made it 2-0 from the penalty spot after Dejan Kulusevski's foul on Danny Welbeck in the penalty area. On sixty-three minutes, Pervis Estupinian added to our miseries when he smashed home from twenty-five yards to make it 3-0. And, with seventy-five minutes on the clock, another Joao Pedro spot-kick for Brighton added to their tally. We did enjoy a late rally when Alejo Veliz scored his first Spurs' goal on eighty-one minutes while Ben Davies headed home to set up a frantic finish. But we could not turn it around and, at the Amex Stadium in Brighton, it finished 4-2.



31 - 12 - 23 Tottenham Hotspur 3 Bournemouth 1



We ended 2023 on a winning note thanks to a 3-1 victory over Bournemouth on New Year's Eve. An early opener as Pape Matar Sarr drilled home on nine minutes before going off injured just after the half-hour mark. Then, there was end-to-end action during the second half when Bournemouth made a great effort in an attempt to level the score. But it was Heung-Min Son who doubled our lead on seventy-two minutes. And Richarlison even made it 3-0 for us with ten minutes remaining. There was also time for a late consolation goal for Bournemouth when Alex Scott was on target to give the travelling fans something to cheer about in the festive season. But, at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, it ended **Tottenham Hotspur 3, Bournemouth 1**.

Aston Villa 2 Tottenham Hotspur 4

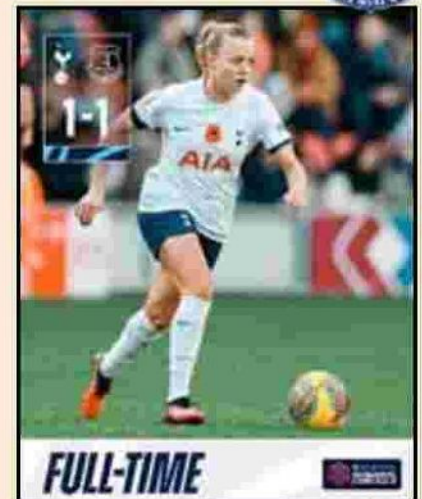

Tottenham Hotspur 1 Everton 1



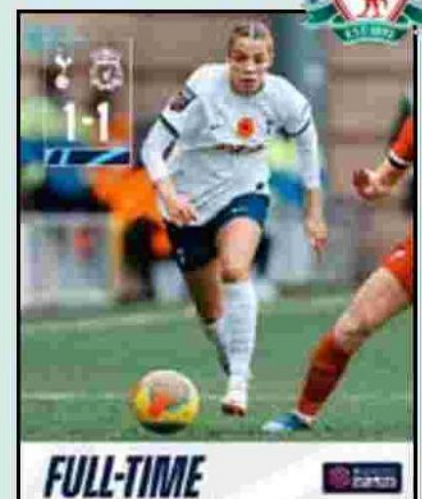

Galli converted past Rebecca Spencer in the 85th minute after Heather Payne was knocked to the ground inside the Spurs box. Tottenham had gone in front after Grace Clinton nodded a deep Drew Spence cross past Courtney Brosnan in the first half. The draw means Tottenham, who had won three consecutive matches before Sunday, are third in the WSL and miss out on a chance to advance to second.



Tottenham Hotspur 1 Liverpool 1



A wonderful solo goal by Norway forward Celin Bizet put Spurs on course for a fourth win in five Women's Super League games. Bizet started the move from inside her own half in the 27th minute before driving at Liverpool's defence and producing an impressive finish past Rachael Laws. Fellow Norwegian Haug, who joined the reds in September from AS Roma, equalised in the 66th minute with a well-placed header following a super cross from substitute Yana Daniels. Liverpool could have won it in the closing stages, but Gemma Bonner's volley flew wide.





Leicester City 1 Tottenham Hotspur 1



Celin Bizet scored a second-half equaliser after Janice Cayman gave the Foxes the lead early on, while Janina Leitzig made a string of saves to thwart the visitors. Spurs have won three WSL games this season, two fewer than the entirety of the last campaign, which ended with Vilahamn's assistant Vicky Jepson in interim charge after Rehanne Skinner was sacked. Vilahamn is remaining optimistic despite a difficult afternoon.



Manchester City 7 Tottenham Hotspur 0

Khadija Shaw scored a first-half hat-trick as Manchester City blew Tottenham away in the Women's Super League. Shaw struck three times in 15 minutes to propel City back into the Champions League places and hand Spurs their heaviest WSL defeat. Laura Coombs scored twice, while Lauren Hemp and Jill Roord also added second-half goals in a superb display by the home side. Tottenham manager Robert Vilahamn told Sky Sports: "Seven-nil is not a fun result, I apologise to the fans about that result, because it's not a result we should have".



Tottenham Hotspur 0 Manchester United 4



Manchester United kept pace in the Women's Super League title race with a comfortable victory at Tottenham Hotspur.

Melvine Malard starred, scoring twice and assisting Ella Toone for her side's second goal, while Hayley Ladd added a late fourth. Spurs are sixth and now winless in five league games. "It was an even game in the first half," Spurs manager Robert Vilahamn told Sky Sports. "We protected the goal well and created counter-attacks, but they scored too many goals. They had around five shots so they are effective with their chances. And then we lost our head a little bit, but we played against a very good team. This is where we are now and we tried to play, but we do need to work a little bit more."

Know Your Spurs

Legends from the Hall of Fame

Ron Burgess 1917 - 2005

William Arthur Ronald Burgess was born in Cwm, South Wales on 9th April 1917. One of the all-time greats, Ron Burgess first caught the attention of Spurs' scouts playing for his local side Cwm Villa. He signed as an amateur for Cardiff City but, with the promised trial not forthcoming, he took a job as a pit boy. A forward at the time, he was taken on Spurs' junior staff but, after less than twelve months, was told that he would not make the grade. Before returning home, perhaps to a job in the pits, he popped into the ground to watch the "A" team play. They were a man short and Ron was asked to fill in at right-half. It was the first time that he had played in anything but a forward position but did so well that Spurs offered him a place on the ground staff. After making his debut as a professional footballer for Spurs against Norwich City in February 1939, he immediately secured one of the half-back positions and, for the next fifteen years, was only absent due to injury, national service or international calls.

An extraordinary human dynamo of a player, he was almost always the best player on the pitch and you had to marvel at the way the Welshman went past players as if they weren't there. He possessed a great engine and was constantly on the move thus facilitating the side's fluid '*push-and-run*' style of football. His distribution, ball control and positional sense were second to none. Ron Burgess also had a great turn of speed and, besides being a great tackler, he could also hit a powerful shot with either foot. As if that weren't enough, he was also formidable in the air. Ron Burgess was the perfect footballer. They don't make them like that any more!

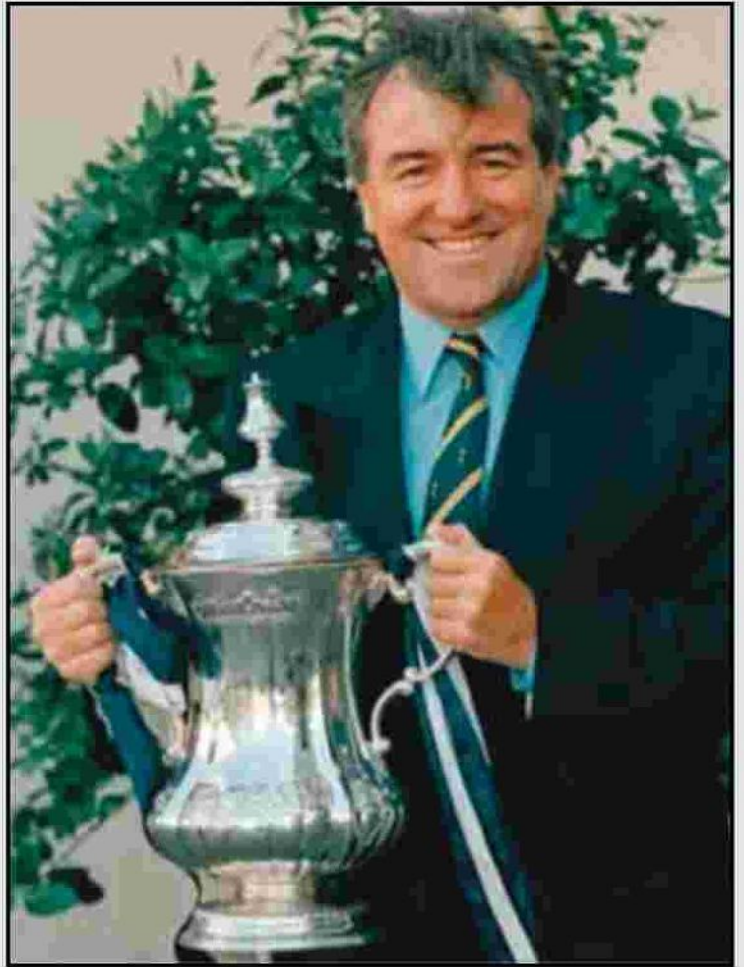
He was soon recognised as the best left-half in the country and one of the finest attacking wing-halves the game has ever known. An inspiring leader, Burgess was not only captain but also the energetic engine-room of Arthur Rowe's '*Push and run*' team that won the Second Division and the Football League Championship between 1949 and 1951. Although it was his incredible stamina and his willingness to support almost every attacking foray that most caught the eye, he could also defend solidly when the situation demanded and he dovetailed perfectly with his half-back partner, Bill Nicholson. When he retired from football, Ron Burgess worked as a stock controller for a stationery concern in Wealdstone and was then employed as a warehouseman in South Harrow. Ron Burgess sadly passed away in February 2005 at the age of eighty-seven.



Obituary Terry Venables 1943 - 2023

We were extremely saddened to learn of the passing of Terry Venables, our former player, manager, and chief executive, who passed away on Saturday, 25th November 2023 at the age of eighty.

An FA Cup winner at Spurs as a player in 1967 and as a manager in 1991, Terry joined us from Chelsea in 1966 and made 141 appearances for us in all competitions, scoring nine goals, until departing for QPR in 1969. However, it's as a manager he'll be most remembered. Taking his first steps into coaching at Crystal Palace in 1975/76, Terry succeeded Malcolm Allison as manager in 1976 and returned to QPR in 1980. But he returned 'home' to White Hart Lane as manager in 1987 and built a team around the likes of Thorstvedt, Mabbutt, Gascoigne and Lineker, that finished third in the old First Division in 1989/90 before winning the FA Cup in 1991. Terry took over as England manager in 1994



and led the national team to the semi-finals of Euro 96. A Spurs' fan growing up, Terry was born in Dagenham, east London, in 1943 and played for England Schoolboys in 1958 before signing as a Chelsea amateur later that year.

He steered Palace from the Third Division to the First Division in just four years before revisiting QPR, guiding them to the FA Cup Final in 1982, where they lost after a replay to Spurs, as we retained the trophy, and promotion to the First Division a year later. In 1984, La Liga giants Barcelona lured Venables to the Nou Camp and he led them to the Spanish title in his first season and the European Cup Final in 1986 only to lose on penalties to Romania's Steaua Bucharest. Terry overcame a tough time initially after returning to Spurs as manager but with that England international spine of Mabbutt, Gazza and Lineker together, finished third in 1989/90 and then memorably lifted the FA Cup in 1991, beating Arsenal in the semi-final, thus preventing the Gunners from winning the double, before overcoming the odds on the day to topple Forest at Wembley.

After Spurs, Venables enjoyed, possibly, his finest moment as a coach by leading an attractive England side to the semi-finals of Euro 96 before that agonising loss against Germany. After spells in the dugout with Australia, Palace again, Middlesbrough and Leeds United, his last senior coaching was back with the Three Lions as assistant to Steve McLaren from 2006-2007.

We all extend our sincere condolences at this sad time to his family and his close friends.



Ange's impact on the club so far

It seems like the team is picking up pace once again as Tottenham, while coming off a loss to Brighton as of writing, have generally been in good form this season.

Luckily, this time the chosen manager was someone not very widely known, coming from Celtic, a superstar awaiting to step in the spotlight (if you will). Ange came in with a bang, bringing back attacking football and, with it, optimism, hope and good prospects for the future.

Overall, it has not been perfect as we did have a losing streak, but as they say, *"Rome wasn't built in a day"*. Ange's impact is being felt as he has taken a club that finished 8th last season to a club that is fighting for top four (arguably even the title). It's now a club that has enough optimism to take on any other team, no matter how much bigger it could be. I suppose *"it's not perfect but it's far from objection worthy"* is quite a fair statement to sum up Ange's impact at the Club so far.

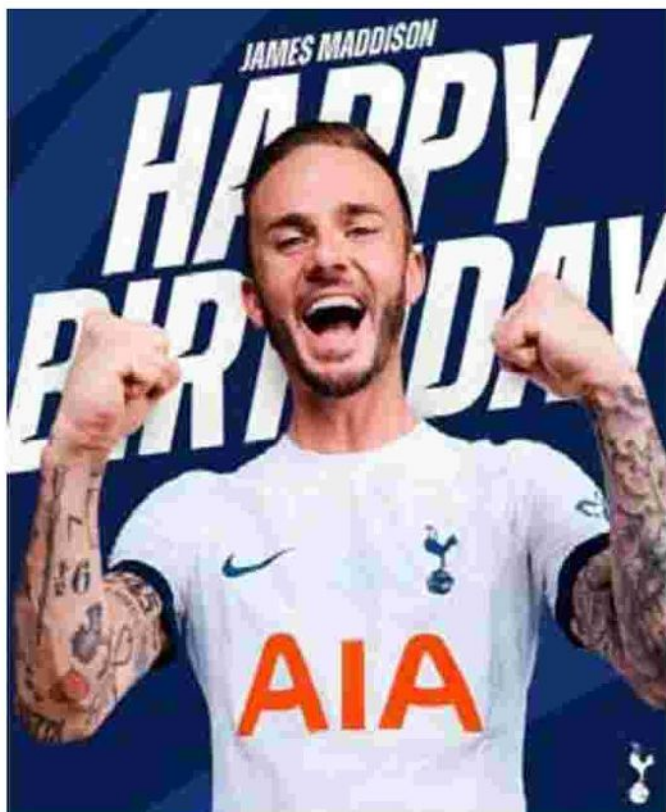

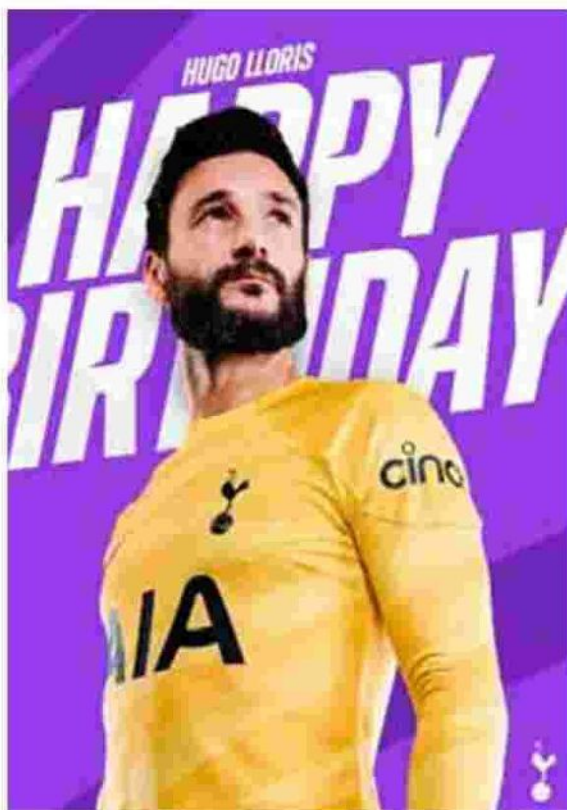

NOVEMBER MASS AT THE CLUB

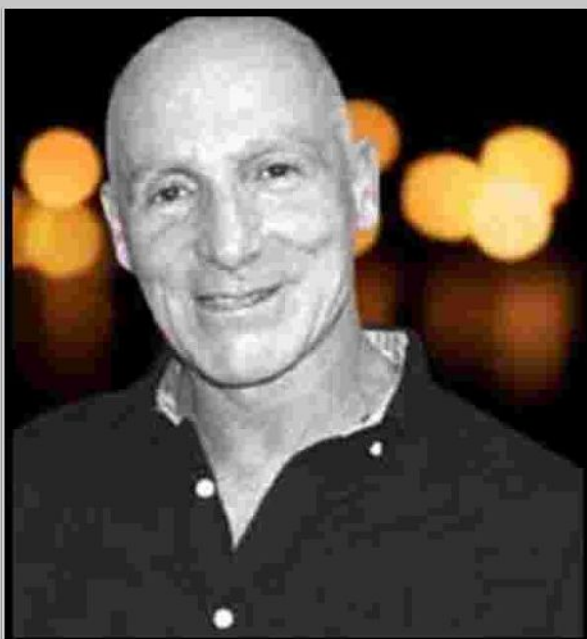
